Meringue Baby Blanket



A blanket designed to be easy, you just keep crocheting until you have used all of one ball then you start the next.

Materials:

1 x Strand 100gm Ball in lightest colour (Almost White Peach - 505, Almost White Teal - 504)

1 x Strand 100gm Ball in slightly darker colour (Titoki Pink - 491, Puka Peacock - 391)

For Larger Size, 1 more Strand 100gm ball in a slightly darker colour (Puka Peacock - 392) 3.5mm Crochet Hook

Measurements:

60cm x 60cm, 70cm x 70cm

Before you give a gift made with Strand Yarn, make a label to attach.

Knitted by
Size
Yarn: Strand Super Fine Yarn (50%Wool/50% Mohair)
Washing Instructions: Hand wash with a pure gentle soap such as lux flakes or Soak

Abbreviations

ch: chain sl st : slip stitch st(s): stitch(es) dc: double crochet

tr: treble

The main pattern is based on clusters of 3 trebles

To Make

Round 1: 6 ch, sl st into 1st ch to form a ring, 3 ch, 11 tr into ring, sl st into beg 3 ch to join up.

Round 2: 3 ch (counts as 1st treble), 2 tr into same st, 1 ch, 3 tr into same st, *skip over a cluster of 3 trebles, 3 tr into next corner, 1 ch, 3 tr into same st, repeat from * 2 more times, sl st into beg 3 ch to join up.

Round 3: 3 ch 3 (counts as 1st treble), 2 tr into same st, 1 ch, 3 tr into same st, skip over a cluster of 3 trebles, 3 tr into next st, ** skip over a cluster of 3 trebles, 3 tr into next corner 1 ch, 3 tr into same st, skip over a cluster of 3 trebles, 3tr into next st, repeat from ** 2 more times, sl st into beg 3 ch to join up.

Continue in this manner until first ball is used up completing a round. 27 - 28 rounds

Add next colour and continue for a further 8 - 10 rounds.

For larger size: add next colour and continue for a further 5 -6 rounds.



All sizes: Last 2 rounds: With same colour as last round, DC into each stitch, In each corner work 1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc.

Handy Tip: Sometimes the square can start to twist, this can be avoided by turning the square over after each round, thus alternating the direction of each round, therefore counteracting the twist.

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
